# **Professional Development - April 9th**

We have received positive feedback regarding our April 9<sup>th</sup> in-service. Our theme for this in-service day was "Let's Taco 'Bout Tech". During the morning session with all staff members in the auditorium, I provided information on the importance of Collective Teacher Efficacy. Later in the day, Lisa Suhr facilitated technology challenges which allowed teachers to take on the role of a student completing projects on their iPads. Most of the teachers enjoyed this interactive format working in teams with other teachers for support. The final portion of the day was spent in content or grade level teams. As a district we continue to try to provide relevant and engaging professional learning that models what we would like to see in our classrooms.

### Feedback regarding the Collective Efficacy Portion of the In-Service:

This was a great topic to dig into before the later activities with Lisa!

Good reminder to remember our purpose, the influence we have as educators, and the effect we can have when we work together as a team.

My take away was efficacy and the importance of a shared belief in the success of ourselves, our students and all who work in this great field!

It is good to realize that we must mirror the type of learner we want students to be.

The elementary teachers will spend time discussing the Social Studies resources and all grade levels will continue to move forward with our Tier 1 Social Emotional Curriculum. This day is a great day to celebrate the wonderful accomplishments of each of our buildings.

### **Outside Visitation Team**

The three members of our Outside Visitation Team (OVT) met with our District Leadership Team (DLT) to review the work we have done for the Kansas Educational System Accreditation (KESA) process on April 11th. In addition to meeting at the district office we toured the Wetmore Academic Center and visited with their IPS Ambassadors to learn more about their IPS process and the work related to career development that is being done during their advisory period.

During this visit we reviewed our action plans and shared the work we have done during year 3 of our accreditation cycle. The team asked questions related to our two goals areas of Rigor and Relevance and our action steps. The conversations we had with our team allowed for productive reflection as we shared the work that we have done in year three of the cycle. As part of our visit we were able to celebrate the great things that are happening in our schools. It was rewarding to hear each building report their progress towards improvement especially in the areas of MTSS and IPS (Individual Plans of Study). As a district we continue to identify ongoing two-way communication as an area of growth. We also discussed the implementation of our behavior interventions as an area where we would like additional support from TASN as we move forward with our MTSS process. # **MTSS Update**

Our students are finishing up the end of year screening in FastBridge. As a BLT we will meet on May  $22^{nd}$  to review end of year data. During this BLT meeting we will look at the progress we've made and continue to utilize the self-correcting feedback loop to problem solve areas that may need adjusting for next year. We have solicited staff feedback throughout the year and are utilizing this feedback to revise our process, interventions and assessments.

#### **Summer Curriculum Work**

We have several teams meeting this summer to work on curriculum and the textbook adoption process. Our social studies teachers will receive training on their new social studies resource and begin revising our curriculum.

# **State Assessment Results Kansas Assessment Program Reports**

# **Sabetha Preschool Meeting**

#### Missouri Western Early College Program

As a result of changes in the requirements for high school teachers to teach college courses we have been searching for alternatives that would allow our students to take college courses taught by our teachers at the high school level. As a result we are forming a partnership with Missouri Western University to offer College Biology at SHS and College Algebra collaboratively with Missouri Western for the 2019-2010 school year. We are excited about providing this opportunity for our students.

#### **Social Studies Textbooks**

Our 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade Social Studies teachers have spent numerous hours over the past year reviewing and piloting social studies resources. Based on this extensive process they are recommending the McGraw Hill Networks program be adopted as our Social Studies resource in grades 6<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>. For the 11<sup>th</sup> grade government resource the recommendation is to utilize the McGruder Government textbook which is published by Pearson. Additionally, Gibbs Smith Education is the publisher of our Kansas History resource utilized at the 7<sup>th</sup> grade level. At the elementary level teachers are continuing to research materials to have a recommendation to the board in the near future.
