Appleseed Innovation Grant Recipients: SES was excited to hear the news that members of our staff were recipients of three of the Appleseed Innovation Grants. A summary of these grants are listed below. Thank you to the USD 113 Foundation and Kent & Donna Saylor for making this opportunity available to our staff members in order to enhance our educational environment.

- Standing Desks: Six (6) Standing desks, which will allow for alternative student posturing in the classroom. Requested by Ms. Lorinda Strahm and Ms. Jennifer Herrmann, 3rd and 4th Grade Classrooms.
- Hands-On Sound Manipulation for Intervention Reading Groups: Tactile letters that can be handled and manipulated by students. Requested by Ms. Shari Frey, Special Education Teacher.
- Nature Sound Scape: A six-foot musical fence, with roof, to be added to the SES Nature Area. Requested by Ms. Holly Meyer, Pre-K Teacher, and Ms. Donna Elder, Co-Teacher.

3rd Grade Trip to Lied Center: On October 24, 2017, SES 3rd graders travelled to Lawrence to visit the Museum of Natural History on the KU campus and attend an educational performance at the KU Lied Center. Students viewed the performance of Jazzy Ash & The Leaping Lizards. This was a very interactive program and students and adults attending thoroughly enjoyed the experience. We would like to thank Kent and Donna Saylor for their donation to the Lied Center that helped establish this opportunity and also provided lunch for all participants.

KU Lied Center Visiting Artist: On Monday, October 9, the SES 3rd graders had the privilege to participate in a workshop with Paige Hernandez in connection with Lied Across Kansas. This program allows the Lied Center

of Kansas to team up with a world-class artist to bring arts education to students of all ages in selected communities in Kansas. Ms. Hernandez, a multifaceted performer, is known for her innovative fusion of poetry, hip-hop, dance and education. Hernandez is a master teaching artist and has taught throughout the country to all ages in all disciplines. To date, she has reached approximately 10,000 students from Pre-K through college level



in over 100 residencies, workshops and performances. *The Huffington Post* also named Hernandez a "classroom hero" because of her outstanding arts integration and work with STEM initiatives. She is a member of Actors' Equity Association and is a critically acclaimed director and dancer. Recently, she was named by American Theatre magazine as one of six top-teaching artists in the United States. Parent/Teacher Conferences: Conferences were held on October 18 -19. Overall, SES had a 96% attendance rate. Parents/guardians of 353 of our 368 students met and discussed student progress with teachers. Many of those who did not attend have rescheduled for an alternative date.
